Copyright & Use Policy

This Copyright & Use Policy governs the use of all SafeChemEdu intellectual property, educational resources, digital content, training materials, publications, downloads, assessments, templates, implementation tools, and associated materials.

By purchasing, accessing, downloading, or using any SafeChemEdu products or services, you agree to comply with this Policy.

1. Ownership of Intellectual Property

All materials supplied by SafeChemEdu are protected by applicable copyright, trademark, intellectual property, and related laws.

This includes, but is not limited to:

- Online courses
- Learning Management System (LMS) content
- Videos and multimedia
- Presentations and slide decks
- Facilitator materials
- Learner resources
- Assessments and answer guides
- Reference texts and publications
- Templates and forms
- Registers and checklists
- Implementation kits
- Graphics, diagrams, flowcharts, and illustrations
- Branding, logos, and trademarks
- Website content

All rights not expressly granted are reserved by SafeChemEdu.



2. Permitted Use

Subject to the applicable licence purchased, users may:

- Access and use materials for personal learning.
- Use resources within their licensed organisation.
- Print reasonable copies for authorised training participants.
- Use implementation templates for internal workplace purposes.
- Retain purchased copies for their own reference and learning.

Use must remain within the scope of the licence purchased.

3. Personal Use Licence

Individual purchasers may:

- Access purchased materials for personal use.
- Download and retain authorised resources.
- Print copies for their own study and reference.

Individual licences do not permit sharing with other persons.

4. Organisational Use Licence

Where an organisational licence has been purchased, authorised personnel may:

- Access materials within the licensed organisation.
- Use resources for internal training purposes.
- Reproduce learner materials for authorised participants.
- Implement templates and workplace tools internally.

Organisational licences do not permit external distribution or commercial resale.

5. Facilitator Use Licence

Facilitator Packs are governed by the SafeChemEdu Facilitator Licence Agreement.

Facilitators may only use materials within the delivery rights granted under their licence.

Additional restrictions may apply depending on the licence purchased.



6. Prohibited Activities

Unless expressly authorised in writing by SafeChemEdu, users must not:

Redistribution

- Share purchased materials with unauthorised persons.
- Distribute materials outside the licensed organisation.
- Email, upload, or transfer materials to third parties.
- Provide copies to colleagues who have not purchased access.

Resale

Users must not:

- Sell SafeChemEdu materials.
- Offer materials as part of another product or service.
- Include materials within commercial training packages.
- Charge fees for redistribution of SafeChemEdu content.

Commercial Exploitation

Users must not:

- Commercially exploit SafeChemEdu intellectual property.
- Use materials to create competing products.
- Incorporate substantial SafeChemEdu content into commercial offerings without written approval.

7. Learning Management Systems (LMS)

SafeChemEdu materials must not be uploaded to:

- Third-party LMS platforms
- Commercial training portals
- Public learning systems
- Membership websites
- File-sharing platforms

without written authorisation from SafeChemEdu.

Licensed LMS Use

Where an organisation has purchased an LMS deployment licence or other written authorisation, materials may be uploaded only in accordance with the terms of that licence.

AI and Automated Systems

Users must not upload, submit, or provide SafeChemEdu materials to artificial intelligence systems, machine learning platforms, large language models, automated content generation systems, or similar technologies for the purpose of reproducing, analysing, recreating, training, or generating derivative works without the prior written consent of SafeChemEdu.

8. Websites and Online Distribution

Users must not:

- Upload materials to public websites.
- Publish materials online.
- Share download links publicly.
- Host resources on unrestricted cloud storage services.
- Make materials available through public repositories.

This restriction applies whether materials are provided free of charge or for payment.

9. Modification of Materials

Users may customise workplace templates, forms, registers, and implementation tools for internal use.

Users must not:

- Remove copyright notices.
 - Remove SafeChemEdu branding where copyright ownership is identified.
 - Claim authorship of SafeChemEdu materials.
 - Publish modified versions as original works.
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10. Assessments and Examination Materials



Assessment materials, answer guides, marking criteria, examination questions, and related resources are confidential educational materials.

Users must not:

- Publish assessment content online.
 - Share answer keys.
 - Distribute examination materials separately from authorised training delivery.
 - Reproduce assessment systems for commercial use.
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11. Copyright Notices

All copyright notices, trademarks, branding, and ownership statements must remain intact.

Users must not:

- Remove copyright statements.
 - Alter ownership notices.
 - Replace SafeChemEdu branding with alternative ownership claims.
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12. Requests for Reproduction Rights

Requests to reproduce, distribute, translate, publish, host, or otherwise use SafeChemEdu materials beyond the licence granted must be submitted in writing to:
